SCOTTISH ACCIDENT PREVENTION COUNCIL AWARDS 1999

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF ROADS

ABSTRACT

This report discusses the Scottish Accident Awards scheme and notes the success of Angus Council in being commended by the Scottish Accident Prevention Council for the production of a road safety leaflet entitled 'Safer Footways For All'.

1 RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Committee agree to note the award of a Certificate of Commendation to Angus Council Roads Department in recognition of their efforts in the field of accident prevention.

2 DETAILS

Report No 1024/99 'Safer Footways For All' approved by the Roads Committee on the 14 October 1999 reported that the Director of Roads had produced an information leaflet (in association with the Scottish Accident Prevention Council) offering advice on keeping footways clear of obstructions. The Scottish Accident Prevention Council (SAPC) hold an annual Accident Prevention Award Competition to recognise those whose efforts in any particular year are worthy of special mention.

Angus Council Roads Department were nominated for an award in Category 1 – Local Accident Prevention Committees/Community Safety Fora and subsequently, the "Safer Footways For All" leaflet was awarded a Certificate of Commendation from the SAPC. (copy attached)
