**BRECHIN COMMON GOOD FUND - USE OF UNDERSPEND WITH REGARD TO
GRANT APPROVED FOR BRECHIN YOUTH PROJECT**

Report by the Chief Executive

ABSTRACT

This report advises Elected Members of the actual expenditure incurred with regard to Report No. 391/02, and sets out proposals for the use of an underspend with regard to this initiative.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that Policy & Resources Committee:-

- i) note that work related to the Brechin Youth Project which was funded through a grant from the Brechin Common Good Fund is now complete, and
- ii) agree that an underspend of £279.78 of the grant awarded, be utilised by the Brechin Youth Project to offset the cost of tables and chairs for the Project.

2. INTRODUCTION

Members' will recall Report No. 391/02 titled "Brechin Youth Project - Common Good Fund", when they agreed to award a grant from the Brechin Common Good Fund, in respect of certain works to develop a youth facility being developed at 19 Clerk Street, Brechin, Angus. The level of grant awarded was £10,320.

The Brechin Youth Project has now advised Angus Council that all monies awarded were used specifically for the items detailed in their application, and has submitted photocopies of receipts.

There is an underspend of £279.78, and Brechin Youth Project has asked that this might be used by them against the purchase of tables and chairs for the Project.

Officers of Angus Council are supportive of this particular course of action.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no additional financial implications arising for Angus Council from this Report.
