THREE-WAY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COMMUNITY FUND (PREVIOUSLY KNOWN AS THE NATIONAL LOTTERY CHARITIES BOARD), ANGUS ASSOCIATION OF VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS AND ANGUS COUNCIL

Report by the Chief Executive

ABSTRACT

This report provides an update of the three-way agreement between the Community Fund, Angus Association of Voluntary Organisations and Angus Council.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Policy & Resources Committee note the contents of the updated three-way agreement between the Community Fund, Angus Association of Voluntary Organisations and Angus Council.

2. BACKGROUND

At its meeting on 8 May 2001, the Policy & Resources Committee approved a three-way agreement reached between the Community Fund (previously known as the National Lottery Charities Board), Angus Association of Voluntary Organisations and Angus Council.

The overall aim of the three-way agreement is to improve the strategic overview of the Community Fund in Angus, and to improve the uptake of funding from that source for the Angus area. The three-way agreement has the following objectives:-

- (a) to inform the voluntary and community sector about the Community Fund and about gaps in funding;
- (b) to work together strategically; and
- (c) to consult on the Community Fund's work.

3. FUTURE

The three-way agreement agreed in May 2001 was for the period February 2001 to March 2002. Discussions have recently taken place with the partners and the three-way agreement has now been updated to include revised responsibilities, for the respective partners, for the period April 2002 to April 2003. A copy of the updated agreement is attached to this report.
