WILLIAM LAMB EXHIBITION IN LUZARCHES

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF LEISURE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

This report proposes that, in conjunction with the Montrose Twinning Association, an exhibition of William Lamb's French works be held in Luzarches, France in May 2004

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Committee agrees:

- a) That a selection of William Lamb's French drawings and etchings, together with a few small sculptures be made available for a small exhibition of his French works to be held in La Salle des Fete, Luzarches over the weekend of 14 – 17 May 2004; and
- b) to approve for insurance purposes, that the Cultural Services Manager accompany the exhibition taking it by car on the Rosyth – Zeebrugues Ferry and that these travel costs would be no more than £600, to be met from the Montrose Common Good Fund.

2. BACKGROUND

The Montrose Twinning Association, which is twinned with Luzarches, France, has approached us to enquire whether a small exhibition of William Lamb's French works could be held in La Salle des Fete of the weekend of 14-17 May 2004.

The proposal was put to the William Lamb Advisory Committee on 19 September 2003 and it agreed that a selection of Lamb's French drawings and etchings, together with a few small sculptures could be made available.

Dr James Morrison, formerly advisor to the Committee, and a member of the Twinning Association Committee indicated that he was willing to assist with the selection and hanging of the exhibition. The Committee gratefully accepted his offer and further agreed that, for insurance purposes, the Cultural Services Manager accompany the exhibition, taking it by car on the Rosyth-Zeebrugues Ferry

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The travel costs of £600 are the only additional costs to the Council, and these will be met from the Montrose Common Good.

4. HUMAN RIGHTS IMPLICATIONS

5. CONSULTATION
