ENVIRONMENTAL & LEISURE SERVICES COMMITTEE – 28 AUGUST 2003 LIBRARIES, MUSEUMS AND HALLS USAGE 2002 - 2003 REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF LEISURE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

This report advises members of the usage of Libraries, Museums and Halls in 2002-03 and compares these with the previous five years.

1. RECOMMENDATION

The committee is asked to note the contents of the report.

2. BACKGROUND

The method of comparison with our statistical returns was changed for the 1999/2000 statistical report and we have retained this form of reporting for the year 2002/2003.

We have sought to compare the current year against an average compiled from the previous five years where data is available in order to provide an overview of the trends in use. The statistical comparison is contained within the appendices attached to this report.

It is evident from the statistical analysis that library issues continue to decline within all sectors of the Library Service reflecting the Scottish trend and have reduced by 17.8% over the last 5 years. This decline appears uniform across the service affecting full-time, part-time and mobile libraries alike.

The number of new additions to the book stock over the last 5 years has fallen by 17.7% which mirrors exactly the decline in library issues for the same period and may be contributing to the decline in library borrowing. This decline in new additions is due to the past seven years of budget cuts.

A number of Reader Development initiatives have been started over the last few years to increase the profile of the Library services including the Summer Reading Challenge for primary children; World Book Day events; development of Reading Groups and author visits and the Service will continue to extend and develop such initiatives to keep the profile of the Library service high within Angus.

Whilst the core lending service has been declining over the last 5 years the general level of library activity has been rising with the number of Reader Enquiries rising by around 10% in the past year. In addition this is the first full year that statistics are available for the Peoples Network Learning Centres in Libraries and it is clear from number of registered Learning Centres members and the number of bookings that this Service is very heavily used reflecting the changing nature of the Library Service locally and nationally.

Partnership arrangements such as those with Careers Scotland to provide online careers information; The Pensions Service to provide online pensions information and NHS Tayside to provide Health Information coupled with the development of online databases such as KnowUK, Britannica online and Newsbank have all contributed to move away from traditional book resources as the principal medium for attaining information.

It is hoped that the introduction of iPac, the Web enabled version of the library catalogue will empower library members to make greater use of resources.

The large number of visitors using this service reflects the large influx of seasonal student workers in Angus during the summer months which has put a considerable strain on library services during that period.

The Local Studies Service shows a decline over the last year both in terms of enquiries and visitors perhaps reflecting the fact that there fewer visitors in Angus. There is no doubt that the events of 11 September, foot and mouth disease and perhaps the cost of fuel have all contributed to this reverse of the trend.

Visitor figures for the museum service show a modest increase on the previous 5 year average but this can be largely attributed to the continued rise in visitor figures at Montrose Museum which have risen by 13.4% over the last 5 years. Visitor figures at both Arbroath and the Meffan show declines of 17.85 and 16.2% respectively.

The statistics for Hall Use and Attendance at events continue to show an increase against the 5 year average. Attendance at events show an overall increase of 27.1% over the current 5 year average and hourly use shows an overall increase of 30.1% over the 5 year average. The only exception is the Webster Theatre which shows a decline of 11.8% in attendance although the hourly use at the Webster has increased by 8.3%.

Some elements of the Educational Resources Service are down on previous years reflecting the changing nature of the service to schools. Schools are continuing to build up their own resources and are more able to satisfy requests from within their own stock. As a result the numbers of items in loan collections, particularly project collections, has been reduced to reflect this increasing self reliance.

The use of Reading for Enjoyment collections which contains author and theme focussed items continue to increase whilst the increase in Artefact borrowing reflects the increasing range and quality of material available
