# HOUSING ACT IMPLEMENTATION FUNDING - HOMELESSNESS LOCAL OUTCOME AGREEMENT PROGRESS REPORT

## REPORT by DIRECTOR OF HOUSING

#### **ABSTRACT**

This report advises members on the progress to date in achieving the targets and outcomes agreed with the Scottish Executive, for Housing Scotland Act Implementation funding for homelessness duties.

### 1. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Housing Committee:

- i. notes the progress to date and,
- ii. in the context of Community Planning, refer this report to the joint Health, Safe and Caring Communities Partnership, for its interest.

#### 2. BACKGROUND

Ministers approved funding over the period 2001-2004 (£3/£12/£12 million) to help local authorities implement additional homeless duties imposed by the Housing (Scotland) Act 2001 and the Homelessness Task Force Final Report. Funding was subject to Local Outcome Agreements with the Scottish Executive.

Housing Committee approved specific outcomes for the two-year period 2002-04, on 16 February 2002.

Angus Council was allocated a total of £634,500 for financial year 2003-04. Offers of grant were received and accepted for £330,000, £65,000 and, £239,500 in January 2002, August 2002 and, January 2003 respectively.

Following an evaluation of progress in 2002-03, revised outcomes were submitted to Communities Scotland in October 2003. The objective priorities remained the same but some of the specific outcomes were refined to take account of other factors and new initiatives influencing strategy implementation.

## 3. OUTCOME AGREEMENT PROGRESS

A draft progress report to Communities Scotland was issued and the total grant allocation of £634,500 has been received.

Where there has not been full spend in the financial year 2003-04, a financial commitment has been made in most cases.

There is some variation between the actual or committed spend and the estimated budget costs, identified at the beginning of 2003 against specific outcomes. The

under spend on implementing the national standards for information and advice and related staff training costs, the upgrading of communal facilities and the provision of furnished tenancies, which have now been funded in terms of the Furnished Tenancies Grant has been reallocated to fund central support costs, which had previously been excluded from budget estimates

Following on from the progress last year which was reported to the Housing Committee in June 2003, the funding has allowed Angus Council to continue developing effective measures to tackle homelessness in partnership with a range of agencies.

A proportion of the grant has continued to fund staff to implement the homelessness strategy. A Strategy Review was completed and reported to the Housing Committee in April 2004. Committee also approved a strategy for Temporary Accommodation and Support Services in August 2003. Development work has continued and significant progress has been made in developing Training, Education and Information and Advice services for young people.

The provision of good quality information and advice can make a significant impact in preventing and alleviating homelessness. Funding to train and support staff to comply with the National Standards for Information and Advice has resulted in staff at the Carnoustie ACCESS Office and all Special Needs Officers gaining accreditation.

Significant progress has been made in partnership with Hillcrest Housing Association to provide good quality temporary accommodation and support services for homeless people in Arbroath and Forfar.

Communal facilities have been upgraded in the Homeless Persons Unit in Montrose and new reception and communal facilities have been provided in the Young Persons Homeless Unit in Arbroath.

Funding to the Angus LHCC to research the health needs of homeless people and bring forward proposals for interagency training and developing services will further the prevention and alleviation of homelessness. A final report from the Angus LHCC is imminent.

Service level agreements are in place with a range of voluntary sector agencies to provide practical assistance to homeless people to set up tenancies, provide independent information and advice and involve service users in service planning and delivery.

Appendix 1 details the local outcome agreement for 2003-04, progress against each target and budget spend.

#### 4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications for Angus Council arising from this report. The total expenditure amounts to £794,561. Implementation funding for 2003-2004 (£634,500) has been awarded by the Scottish Executive and any additional expenditure has been contained within this grant or met from the under spend carried forward from the previous year (£160,061)

#### 5. HUMAN RIGHTS IMPLICATIONS

It is considered that in following the recommendations contained within this report, the Council would not be acting in any way that is incompatible with human rights.

#### 6. CONSULTATION

The Chief Executive, the Director of Law and Administration, the Director of Finance, the Director of Social Work and Health have been consulted in the preparation of this report.

#### 7. CONCLUSION

Angus Council has achieved the priority objectives and met most of specific targets agreed with the Scottish Executive. Where slippage has occurred, significant progress has been made towards meeting these targets.
