TEMPORARY TRAFFIC ORDERS

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

This Report relates to the making of Temporary Traffic Orders as detailed below.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee is requested to note that the undernoted Temporary Traffic Orders have been made at the request of the Head of Roads:

- (i) The Angus Council (Christmas Lights Switching on and Children's Winning Designs Ceremony in Montrose) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 2008 between the hours of 4.00pm and 7.00pm on Thursday 4 December 2008 in order to facilitate the switching on of the Christmas Lights and the Children's Winning Designs Ceremony.
- (ii) The Angus Council (Christmas Lights Switching on and a Christmas Market in Arbroath) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 2008 between the hours of 10.00am and 9.00pm on Saturday 6 December 2008 in order to facilitate the switching on of the Christmas Lights and to hold a Christmas Market.
- (iii) The Angus Council (Abbey Green Park Footpath, Arbroath) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 2008 for 1 week commencing Monday 1 December 2008 for the purpose of carrying out path repair work.
- (iv) The Angus Council (Extravaganza and Street Fair in Montrose) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 2008 between the hours of 9.00am and 6.00pm commencing Sunday 14 December 2008 in order to facilitate the holding of and Extravaganza and Street Fair.
