TEMPORARY TRAFFIC ORDERS

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

This report relates to the making of Temporary Traffic Orders as detailed below.

1. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee is requested to note that the undernoted Temporary Traffic Orders have been made at the request of the Head of Roads:

- (i) The Angus Council (Car Parking Area at the Town House, High Street, Montrose) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving) Order 2009 between the hours of 6.00pm on Saturday 7 November until 7.00pm on Sunday 8 November both days 2009 for the purposes of holding a Continental Market;
- (ii) The Angus Council (Central Forfar) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 2009 between the hours of 12.00 noon and 1.30pm on Sunday 8 November 2009 for the purposes of a Remembrance Day parade and service;
- (iii) The Angus Council (High Street, Carnoustie) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) Order 2009 between the hours of 1.00pm and 2.30pm on Sunday 8 November 2009 for the purposes of a Remembrance Day parade and service;
- (iv) The Angus Council (Switching on of Christmas Lights in Forfar) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Waiting) (Suspension of The One Way Traffic System) Order 2009 between the hours of 5.45pm and 7.30pm on Thursday 26 November 2009 for the purposes associated with the switching on of the Christmas Lights in Forfar; and
- (v) The Angus Council (Switching on of Christmas Lights in Kirriemuir) (Temporary Prohibition of Driving and Suspension of Exemption) Order 2009 between the hours of 4.00pm and 5.30pm on Saturday 28 November 2009 for purposes associated with the switching on of the Christmas Lights in Kirriemuir.
