**ABSTRACT:**

This report presents the 2012/13 mid year performance report on the Angus Community Plan and Single Outcome Agreement 2011-14.

**2. BACKGROUND**

The Community Plan and Single Outcome Agreement for 2011-14 outlines the five priority areas that the community planning partnership has agreed to focus on to support the partnership vision:

‘Angus is a place where a first class quality of life can be enjoyed by all’.

The plan also identifies the local outcomes which are based around the partnership’s five priorities to improve quality of life and opportunities for individuals, families and communities in Angus. They also contribute towards the Scottish Government’s national outcomes.

**3. MID YEAR PERFORMANCE REPORT 2012/13**

The report is divided into five sections to reflect the five partnership priorities. Responsibility for delivering on plans and actions against each priority rests with one of the five thematic partnerships:

It should be noted that not all of the measures contained in the report are suitable for mid year reporting e.g. educational attainment. A full analysis of progress against our priorities will be reported in the full year progress report.
