**REFUSE COLLECTION AND WASTE MANAGEMENT ETC ARRANGEMENTS - ST ANDREWS DAY
HOLIDAY 2001**

REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

ABSTRACT

Due to the Council wide staff holiday for St Andrew's Day on Friday 30 November 2001 it will be necessary to alter refuse collection and other waste and cleansing services during that week.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Committee approve:

- a) the adjustments to days of refuse and waste paper collections as detailed in Section 2 of this report, and,
- b) the arrangements for other cleansing and waste management services outlined in Section 3 to this report.

**2. REFUSE COLLECTION ETC ARRANGEMENTS DURING THE WEEK OF ST ANDREW'S DAY
HOLIDAY**

- Friday 30 November domestic refuse collections in towns change to Monday 3 December (thereafter back to normal collection day).
- Friday 30 November commercial refuse collection in towns change to Monday 3 December.
- Friday 30 November rural refuse collections as normal.
- Monday 3 December newspaper collection postponed to Monday 17 December.

These changes represent the minimum disruption possible. Each household and commercial premises affected by changes will receive a handbill advising of the changes. Additionally alterations to services will be announced in the press.

3. OTHER SERVICE ARRANGEMENTS

- All public toilet facilities, including superloos, will operate as normal.
- Recycling Centres will operate to normal winter time openings.
- Street Cleaning will be subject to skeleton service on 30 November and include essential litter bin emptying.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The arrangements for the alterations to service can be met from budget.

5. CONSULTATION

The Chief Executive, Director of Finance, Director of Law and Administration and Contract Services Manager have been consulted on the contents of this report.
