**PUBLIC HOLIDAYS 2001**  
**REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF PERSONNEL**

**ABSTRACT**

This report proposes dates for the seven fixed public holidays during the year 2001 for non teaching employees.

**1. RECOMMENDATION(S)**

The Committee agrees seven fixed public holidays for non teaching employees as proposed in this report for the year 2001.

**2. INTRODUCTION**

As noted by the Personnel and Property Services Committee of 1 September 1998, public holiday entitlement for non teaching employees comprises seven fixed public holiday dates and five days to be taken on a flexible basis. An exception to this arrangement are certain categories of employees within the Contract Services Department who have twelve fixed public holidays. The pattern for the seven fixed public holidays for 2000 was agreed by Angus Council as 3 and 4 of January (New Years holidays), 3 April (Easter holiday), 1 May (Europe Day), 30 November (St Andrews Day) and 25 and 26 December (Christmas holidays).

**3. PUBLIC HOLIDAYS FOR 2001**

Following the above pattern the fixed public holidays to tie in with the proposed school holidays would be:

Monday 1 January 2001  
Tuesday 2 January 2001  
Monday 2 April 2001  
Monday 7 May 2001  
Friday 30 November 2001  
Tuesday 25 December 2001  
Wednesday 26 December 2001

**4. CONSULTATION**

The trade unions were consulted on the proposed Holiday dates for the year 2001 at a meeting of the Central Consultative Committee held on 17 August 2000.

The Chief Executive, Director of Law and Administration and Director of Finance have also been consulted on the terms of this report.

**5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

There are no financial implications arising from the content of this report.

**6. CONCLUSION**

It is important that public holidays are considered and dates set by Angus Council as early as possible so that the public and employees can be informed.
