30 MPH SPEED LIMIT AT HUNTINGFAULDS ROAD, TEALING

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF ROADS

ABSTRACT

This report deals with the proposed 30 mph speed limit at Huntingfaulds Road, Tealing.

1 RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee agree to the promotion of the necessary Traffic Regulation Variation Order to provide a 30mph speed limit on a section of Huntingfaulds Road, Tealing.

2 DETAILS

Following the recent introduction of a 30 mph speed limit on the Tealing – Auchterhouse Road at Tealing a number of local residents requested further speed restrictions on other local roads. Several were not considered appropriate in the open countryside but it was agreed in consultation with Tayside Police that a speed limit of 30mph on the built-up section of Huntingfaulds Road would be appropriate.

The section of affected road is indicated on the attached plan No. T.01-013/01.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the proposals is £500 and this can be contained within the 2001/2002 Revenue Budget for Traffic. Additional maintenance costs would amount to £50 per annum and this would require to be contained in future years Revenue Budgets.

4 HUMAN RIGHTS IMPLICATIONS

There are no human rights implications arising from the proposals in this report.

5 CONSULTATION

The Chief Executive, the Director of Law and Administration, the Director of Finance and the Chief Constable have been consulted in the preparation of this Report.

6 CONCLUSION

In the interest of pedestrian and traffic safety the above new speed restrictions are considered appropriate . The variation of the current Traffic Regulation Orders to impose the new limit is therefore necessary.
